It was discovered that it was 5 people who broke in and were convicted for an attempted burglary. Through investigation they were caught with money from the Nixon re-election campaign. The investigation took place by Carl Bernstein and Bob Woodward, journalists working at the Washington Post. The Maine Ship

In 1889, The Maine Ship was a Navy ship that sank in Havana. It was sent to Havana to protect United States interests during the Cuban War of Independence. American Newspapers claimed the ship was sunk by the Spanish, This led to the phrase being coined “Remember The Maine! To hell with Spain!” This contributed to the outbreak of the Spanish-American war. In 1976, a team of American naval investigators concluded that The Maine ship explosion was likely caused by a fire that ignited its ammunition stock and not by the Spanish. The Pentagon Papers were published by the Washington Post and other newspapers in an attempt to uncover the truth. The Pentagon Papers showed that the government lied about our involvement in Vietnam. The Pentagon Papers displayed many secrets that were being hidden from the public. Firstly, the Pentagon Papers suggested that the Vietnam war was unnecessary. It showed that JFK had actively helped overthrow and assassinate the South Vietnamese president Ngo Dinh Diem in 1963. During this time, the government was trying to stop the publishing of these papers as it was classified and they believed it was a risk for people to know. The papers were obtained from a man named Daniel Elsiberg. He worked for a company called RAND and the Department of Defense. He had access to the files and when he read what they said he believed that the public had a right to know. So years later he gave his copies to news companies for them to publish. The New York Times was the first to publish and went to court for it. It was then ruled that it was a part of the first amendment and they were allowed to publish. This led to the Washington Post publishing the rest of the Pentagon Papers they had. Journalism uncovered a hard truth in this instance. It helped in letting the public know the truth and teach them that you can't always believe what your leaders tell you.
